Projects that restore, revitalize or enhance the environment and/or promote the protection and welfare of animals in Palm Beach County.



Projects that improve the mental and/or physical well-being of people living in Palm Beach County.


IMPACT MODEL



For every 100 members, we are able to invest \$100,000 directly into improving our community. The exact amount of funds available to award in any given year depends on the number of women who join the organization each year.

Since our founding in 2015, Impact the Palm Beaches has invested \$1.5 million in our community.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS


- The applicant must be a tax-exempt organization under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and designated as such for at least 19 months.
- The organization must be able to provide the following documents:
 - IRS Form 990
 - Financial statements audited by an independent accountant or accounting firm (a financial review or compilation prepared by a Certified Public Accountant will also be accepted)
 - IRS 501(c)(3) Determination Letter
 - Florida Department of Agriculture Solicitation Permit
- Recipients of an Impact the Palm Beaches \$100,000 grant are not eligible to receive a grant for at least 4 years from the date the grant was awarded. Organizations chosen as grant recipients in April 2023 are not eligible to receive a grant until April 2027. Merit award winners may reapply the following year. Recipients of a \$100,000 grant cannot receive new grant funds through paid collaborations within the 4-year time period.
- The program may be new, an expansion of an existing program, or a collaborative effort between more than one qualifying agency.
- The organization must use the full amount of the grant within two years of the award date.

- Grants to individuals
- Grants to private foundations
- Religious organizations for religious purposes

*CAPITAL CAMPAIGN: A capital campaign is an organized drive to collect and accumulate <u>SUBSTANTIAL</u> funds to finance major needs of an organization such as a building or major repair or remodeling project. Capital campaigns are different than requests for capital grants to fund specific equipment, building costs, vehicles or materials that are clearly wrapped around a program or a project serving clients of the organization. Impact the Palm Beaches <u>WILL</u> permit grant requests for capital projects.

GRANT PROCESS



GRANT REVIEW

Impact the Palm Beaches Grant Committee members are responsible for carefully vetting grant applications and selecting finalists who will present at the Annual Impact Award Celebration. Committee members serve as the eyes and ears of the entire membership.

Committee members extensively review and score grant proposals, attend agency site visits, and meet to vote on which proposals to move forward. At the Awards Celebration, ALL members of Impact the Palm Beaches vote and winning programs are selected by majority vote.

The Grant Committee is made up of about 30 members of Impact the Palm Beaches. Members have diverse backgrounds, professional skills, work histories, and nonprofit experience.

Training is provided to members, including how to review financial data and IRS 990s.

These are volunteer positions.

Alzheimer's Community Care | \$100,000 | Fostering Independence

Funds are being used to purchase an application that helps those with early-stage Alzheimer's disease to organize their habits and routines into visual maps, and to pay a portion of the salary of a Family Nurse Navigator to assist families with the application.

Center for Child Counseling | \$100,000 | Keeping Kids Safe

Funds are being used to provide an age-appropriate and interactive curriculum to 12 elementary schools that simplifies the sensitive topic of child sexual abuse and trafficking prevention. Funds cover salaries, program materials, and a multimedia campaign.

Wounded Veterans Relief Fund | \$100,000 | Emergency Dental Care for Disabled Veterans 100% of funds are being used to provide emergency/essential dental care to disabled veterans who do not qualify for VA dental coverage.

Families First | \$77,000 | Infant Mental Health

Funds are being used to cover staff salaries for clinicians to observe Head Start classrooms at Title 1 schools and work with teachers and parents to develop treatment plans.



- The Letter of Intent is in Microsoft Word and should be submitted as a Word document. The signature page and all other required documents should be submitted as PDFs. Specified word counts should be adhered to. Text that goes over the word limit will be manually deleted.
- 3. Detailed instructions on how to submit the Letter of Intent and accompanying documents can be found on the form.
- 4. Your application <u>is only considered accepted</u> when you are sent an email confirmation specifying so.

(the "Organization") as of and for the year ended June 30, 2021, in accordance with U.S. generally accepted auditing standards, we considered the Organization's internal control over financial reporting (internal control) as a basis for designing auditing procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances for the purpose of expressing our opinion on the financial statements, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Organization's internal control. Accordingly, we do not express an opinion on the effectiveness of the Organization's internal control.

A deficiency in internal control exists when the design or operation of a control does not allow management or employees, in the normal course of performing their assigned functions, to prevent, or detect and correct, misstatements on a timely basis. A *material weakness* is a deficiency, or a combination of deficiencies in internal control, such that there is a reasonable possibility that a material misstatement of the entity's financial statements will not be prevented, or detected and corrected, on a timely basis.

Our consideration of internal control was for the limited purpose described in the first paragraph and was not designed to identify all deficiencies in internal control that might be material weaknesses. Given these limitations, during our audit, we did not identify any deficiencies in internal control that we consider to be material weaknesses. However, material weaknesses may exist that have not been identified.
